
Figure 1. World grasslands





# Grasslands Protected Areas Task Force

Goal: "10 in 10 in 10"

To achieve protection for 10% of temperate grasslands in 10 priority regions of the world over the next 10 years



Grasslands Protected Areas Task Force

#### **Goals of the Grasslands Protected Areas Task Force**

•

global assessment of the number, location, geographic extent, biophysical representation and condition of protected areas in the temperate grasslands biome



determine gaps in the protected areas system for temperate grasslands, identify potential candidate areas for filling those gaps, analyze constraints to achieving their protection



develop a global strategy and region-specific action plans to achieve an expanded system of protected grassland areas



identify prevailing management issues and practices that may impact on biophysical condition and the long term maintenance of biodiversity in grassland protected areas; and




develop a set of best management practices and guidelines for grassland protected areas.



### WWF's priority sites in Northern Great Plains




Cooperative conservation planning at the landscape level




Helping to set Canada's future conservation agenda by:

- •Recommending priority actions needed to protect, recover and restore nature




## The Nature Audit's analysis framework: the State-Pressure Response model






